The Title IX policies exist for a reason and are an appropriate topic of conversation on our campus.

[I agree. It is. I just wish we did a better job as an institution safe guarding accused students' due process rights. The preponderance of the evidence standard in adjudication is particularly wrong-headed. Granted, we are constrained in California by the preponderance of the evidence language tacked on to California's SB-967, but there are still steps USC can take to better safe-guard the rights of the accused. We don't have to combine information from multiple complaints in a single case, but at present we do. The practice leaves any two students in position to conspire to destroy a third.]

If you believe that accusers lie, you should also believe that abusers lie.

[Untruths abound, which is why due process is so important. I don't like type II errors, but I like type I errors less, so I know the trade-off I favor.

Quality universities only accept transfer students who are in good standing at the institutions they leave. Being expelled is a *de facto* economic death sentence. At present, I think we are too casual about the possibility of punishing the innocent. Jim
