LAWS TO BE REPEALED

Introduction

Many states have enacted laws affecting civics and history education that should be repealed in whole or in part. These laws either distract from and abbreviate a proper education in civics and history, or directly undermine it. Our model civics legislation implicitly overrides a great many of these laws, but state legislators should remove these laws entirely.

Radical Ideals

Many states now explicitly direct civics and history standards to satisfy ideals such as "diversity," "multiculturalism," and "intersectionality." Such words now euphemize radical activism such as critical race theory and underwrite action civics. All state laws that require civics and history instruction to forward these ideals should be repealed in whole or in part.

"Studies" Courses

Several states mandate "studies" courses, including Black studies, diversity studies, Ethnic studies, Hispanic studies, multicultural studies, and Native American studies. These studies courses further radical identity group ideology, and are based in activist disciplines whose bread and butter is action civics. All state laws that require or allow these "studies" courses should be repealed in whole or in part.

Miscellaneous Requirements

Several states have passed requirements for study of current events, study of environmental principles in social studies classes, human rights, and media literacy ("digital citizenship"). All these laws are susceptible to misuse by radical activists. Media literacy, for example, becomes instruction on why to credit only news stories that align with radical activist beliefs. Human rights instruction becomes instruction in why radical policy goals are human rights. All state laws that contain these miscellaneous requirements should be repealed in whole or in part.
